BAPTISM (Christening)

We are very happy to christen children or adults at St Mary's church if they live in the parish or are on the church electoral roll. If they live in another parish, we may need to consult with their own parish priest to get his or her good will for the christening to happen here. Christenings can happen on a Sunday morning service or at another time – we will try to be as flexible as possible about dates and times.

GETTING MARRIED AT ST MARY'S

We will be delighted to conduct your marriage here at St Mary's church. You can get married here if at least one of you lives in the parish or are on the church electoral roll or have a "qualifying connection" with the church, which covers a wide range of circumstances. Most people can get married at St Mary's church. Please contact us to talk about this. We will marry those who have been divorced, under some circumstances, but we will need to meet with you to talk about it first. We are also happy to help you renew your vows, for example at a significant anniversary. At the moment, we can't legally marry same-sex couples, however, we can offer pastoral support in respect of your marriage/civil partnership in accordance with the Church of England House of Bishops' 2014 guidance (para 18).

BURIAL OR INTERMENT OF ASHES

Those who live in the parish at the time of their death or who are on the church electoral roll are entitled to burial in the Storrington churchyard. Because the churchyard is short of space, we cannot allow burial of those outside the parish. The same applies to the interment of ashes. Check with www.achurchnearyou.com to see if you live in the parochial parish of Storrington.

FUNERAL SERVICES

We are always happy to conduct funeral services either in church or at a crematorium or cemetery, whether the burial is to happen at Storrington or not, and will work with you to put the funeral together as you want it.

FAMILY/LOCAL HISTORY

For information about records held at St Mary, Storrington, please contact our Rectory Office on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, 10am – 1pm. The Storrington & District Museum, based in the Old School next to the church, may also be of help to you. The museum is usually open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday.

SUNDAY WORSHIP

8 am, 10 am, and 6 pm (4pm winter)

The **morning** services are at 8am and 10am. The **8am service** is a small and contemplative traditional language Holy Communion service from the Book of Common Prayer.

The **10am service** is a sung Holy Communion service in modern language from Common Worship, which lasts just over an hour. Services are also live-streamed – please ask for details. Refreshments, including Fairtrade filter coffee, and friendly chat follow all the 10am services.

10 am 2nd Sunday of the month All+Sorts Service
Celebrating that God really does call all sorts of people to worship together. Come for coffee and croissants from 09.30am. Service lasts an hour.

Our **evening** services take place on the **1st & 2nd Sundays** of the month and are smaller and more meditative in tone, lasting around 30 to 45 minutes. Normally Evensong, with sung canticles, responses, and hymns. There is also a short homily talk.

ON SUNDAY MORNINGS... We like having children in our worship just as they are! If you feel an hour-long service is too long for them, a handy hint is to come halfway through – at around 10.30, when most of the "sitting and listening" bits of the service have finished – readings, sermon etc. so they and you can be there for communion and for the refreshments and chat afterwards.

Children are most welcome on any Sunday or during the week to make use of the children's area at the back of the church, which has toys, books, and other activities around Christian themes.

MESSY CHURCH takes place on the **1st Saturday of the month at 9.30-11.00am in church**, for craft activities, games, songs, Godly Play and delicious treats! It's about fun, friendship, faith and discovering God's love in Jesus. It's for everyone and all ages!
